

RFA Title: **Meaningful Day Mini-Grants**
Application Deadline: **March 31, 2020**

Questions and Answers

Question 1:	If we applied for the Meaningful Day Mini-Grants before, can we apply again?
Answer:	Yes. If your previous application was not funded, you may re-apply. We encourage you to review the RFP information that is found on the TCDD website at https://tcdd.texas.gov/meaningful-day-mini-grants-3/ related to the Meaningful Day Mini-Grants. One organization may have up to three grants at any one time. This does not include stipends.
Question 2:	I did not get to hear all the informational webinar presentation. How do we ask questions later?

Question 3:	If we are not already a Medicaid provider, can we qualify to apply for this grant?
Answer:	Medicaid Waiver providers are the primary audience for the Meaningful Day Mini-Grants, and applicants who are providers may be given priority to receive funding. An entity wishing to apply to become a Medicaid Waiver provider can contact the Texas Health and Human Services Commission. If you are not a Medicaid provider, you are still eligible to receive this grant funding. Please provide a detailed description of the type of services and supports you provide to individuals with developmental disabilities.

Question 4: Are you unlikely to fund an organization that isn't a Medicaid waiver service provider if the proposal improves access for waiver recipients and other people with disabilities to meaningful employment and community activities? Will the organization's status as a Medicaid waiver provider or sub-contractor be a determining factor regardless of the merits of the proposal?

Answer: Medicaid Waiver providers are the primary audience for the Meaningful Day Mini-Grants, and applicants who are providers may be given priority to receive funding. An entity wishing to apply to become a Medicaid Waiver provider can contact the Texas Health and Human Services Commission. If you are not a Medicaid provider, you are still eligible to receive this grant funding. Please provide a detailed description of the type of services and supports you provide to individuals with developmental disabilities.

Question 5: How many projects do you plan to fund this cycle? Is it possible for you to fund 10 new grants this cycle or do you have continuing grants that reduce the number of new grants available? If so, what is the maximum number of grants you can fund this cycle?

Answer: Up to 10 projects will be funded this round under this RFP. The Council will consider eligible applications and make the selections and funding decisions.
