What is Vocational Rehabilitation?

- The Vocational Rehabilitation (VR) program helps people with disabilities prepare for, enter, engage in, or advance in competitive employment.
 - Youth: 14-22
 - Adults
- The program also helps businesses and employers recruit, retain and accommodate employees with disabilities.

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Eligibility Requirements

- I. The Individual must have a disability (physical, mental, emotional, or sensory).
 - SSDI or SSI are automatically eligible but not required
 <u>~A disability can be visible or non-visible~</u>
- II. The disability must result in a substantial impediment to employment.
- III. The individual must require VR services to prepare for, enter, engage in, or advance in competitive employment.
- IV. The person must want to work.

Income is not a consideration for Eligibility.



The VR program receives 78.7 percent of its funding through a grant from the U.S. Department of Education. For the 2021 Federal fiscal year, the total amount of grant funds awarded are \$295,273,713. The remaining 21.3 percent (\$79,915,249) are funded by Texas State Appropriations.

For purposes of the Supported Employment program, the VR agency receives 90 percent of its funding through a grant from the U.S. Department of Education. For the 2021 Federal fiscal year, the total amount of grant funds awarded are \$1,471,020. The remaining 10 percent (\$81,723) are funded by Texas State Appropriations.

For purposes of the Independent Living Services for Older Individuals who are Blind program, the VR agency receives 90 percent of its funding through a grant from the U.S. Department of Education. For the 2021 Federal fiscal year, the total amount of grant funds awarded are \$2,189,102. The remaining 10 percent (\$243,234) are funded by Texas State Appropriations.
