Building Better Futures Program for Students with IDD

HB 2081 would establish the Building Better Futures Program. This program would facilitate funding for Comprehensive Transition and Postsecondary (CTP) programs for students with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD) across higher education institutions in Texas. CTP programs would provide educational and occupational skills training opportunities and support services to students with IDD in an inclusive and age-appropriate environment. The bill lists eligibility criteria for institutions of higher education and for participating students.




The Higher Education

Data show CTP programs to be effective at leading graduates to meaningful employment and improved economic self-sufficiency. Despite this, Texas has only 4 approved CTP programs, less than other states. Florida has 21, Tennessee has 7, Louisiana has 5, and Pennsylvania has 12.



In 2023, supporters of a similar bill included The Arc of Texas, National Association of Social Workers - Texas, Texas Association of Goodwills, the Texas Council of Community Centers, Texas Parent to Parent, and United Ways of Texas.
