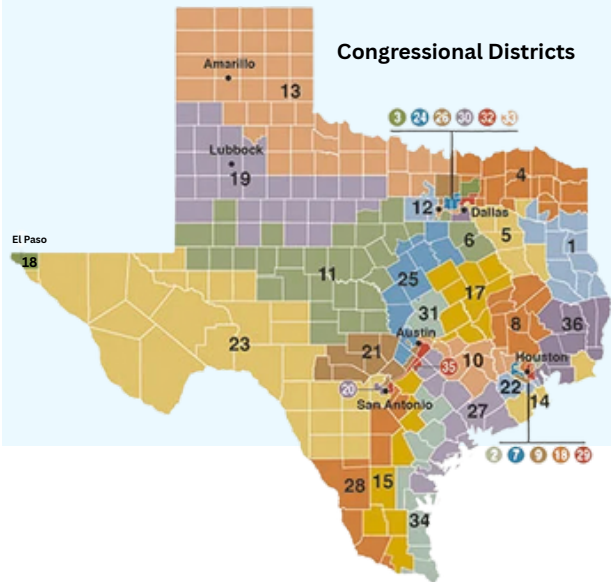

ADMINISTRATIVE COSTS

EMPLOYMENT

64% of Medicaid adults are working either full-time or part-time. Many people who use Medicaid work in low-wage jobs or industries that do not offer health insurance.



ENROLLEE BUY-IN

In Texas, the **Medicaid Buy-In program** allows working adults with disabilities, or families of children with disabilities, to "buy into" Medicaid coverage. This contribution allows them access to essential services.

175,406

175,406 Texans have requested a Medicaid waiver.

17 YEARS

The **expected wait time** to be considered for a waiver is 17 years.
